School Board Constitutional Duties

"The school board shall operate, control and supervise all free public schools within the school district and determine the rate of school district taxes within the limits prescribed [by the constitution]." (Florida Constitution)

School Boards are also responsible for:

- Adopting curriculum and behavior standards and policies;
- Establishing schools, school attendance areas, and school calendar;
- Governing personnel matters;
- Collectively bargaining employee salaries;
- Adopting standards of ethical conduct for instructional personnel and school administrators.
